IAR and ISA Testing

Congratulations to all students in grades 3-8 for completing and working hard on their IAR testing this year.

School Day SAT

Juniors will take the SAT on April 16. The test consists of a 64 minute Reading and Writing Test, a 70 minute Math test, and a 50 minute Essay section. There are lots of places that your student can be practicing and preparing for this test. Some of my favorites are Bluebook (found under Apps on the student's chromebooks), Khan Academy (<https://www.khanacademy.org/>), Power Source (https://www.powerscore.com/sat/help/content_practice_tests.cfm), and ACT Practice Problems (<https://www.act.org/content/act/en/products-and-services/the-act/test-preparation/math-practice-test-questions.html?page=0&chapter=0>). These are scores that your student will use to be admitted into college and qualifying for scholarships. Taking this test is also a graduation requirement, so the students must participate.

Hoyleton Medical Clinic will be returning to Patoka School on Thursday, May 9th, 2024 for a sports physical clinic at a discounted rate for our students! The tentative start time of the clinic is 1:30 pm.

The cost of the sports physical is only \$10. Payment must be in the form of cash or check. You may make the check payable to: Denise Orrill.

As usual, there will be a sign-up sheet for this clinic. Please sign up your child as soon as possible by contacting me at (618) 432-5200. The new Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Pre-Participation Physical Evaluation form (sports physical-form) will be required. Without it, your child may not participate. Specifically, parents/guardians must complete the bottom of the **front page**, the entire **second page**, and the entire **third page** of the form AND sign/date the bottom. Additionally, your child will need to sign and date it in order for the form to be considered valid! The medical provider will complete the last page!

IMPORTANT: If your child will be entering either 6th or 9th grades NEXT school year, then he/she will be required to have a school physical, which is not the same as a sports physical. This means that there's no need to get a sports physical, because the school physical will cover the state requirement AND all sports!

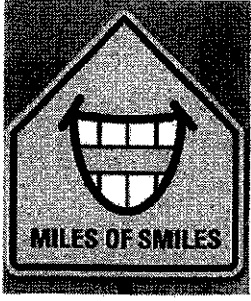

Quick Start Training for Parents/Students and Receiving All Calls

1. To receive all calls from the school: add a new contact in your phone and label it Patoka All Call. Use 844-471-2168 as the phone number. This is the phone number that has been assigned to Patoka School. By adding this phone to your contacts...anyone with a spam blocker will be able to receive calls from this number. Once you've created the Patoka All Call contact, text start to that phone number/contact. By texting start, this should opt you into messages.

4. Click on **Assignments** - your students homework and the due date can be found here.

6. Click on **Attendance** - contains date and times of all student absences and tardies.
7. Click on **Send Email** - easy way to find a teacher email and send them a private email.
8. Click on **Email Logs** - all emails are logged in the TeacherEase database.
9. Click on **Class** - this covers students classes, schedule and associated grading scales.
10. Click on **Fees** - this contains up to date information pertaining to breakfast & lunch.
11. Click on **Locker Num/Combo**- locker and combination information is available here.

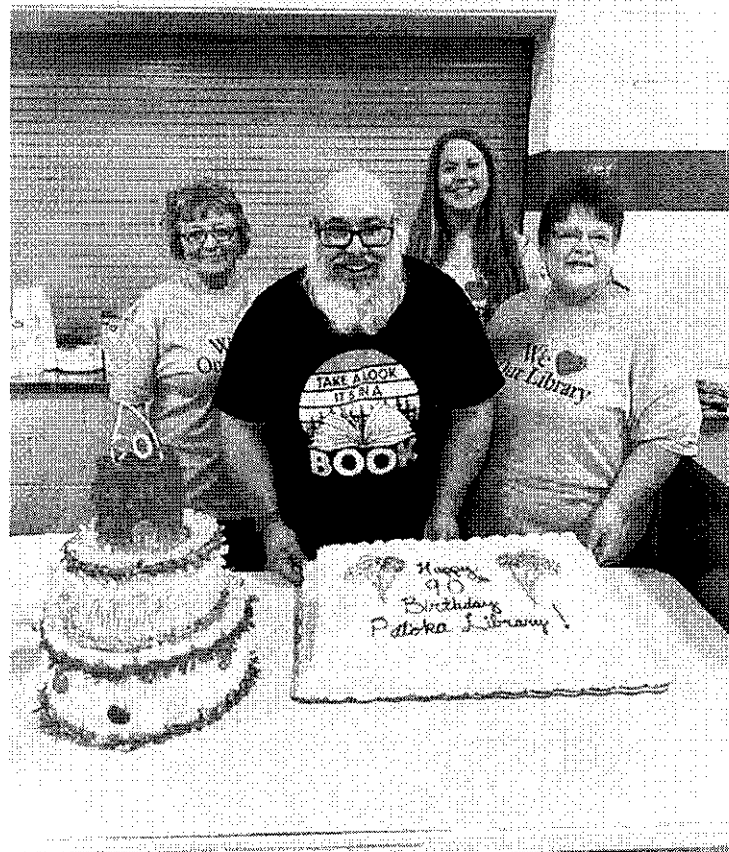

Sign In and Out



Children are required to be signed in and out of Summer Day Camp by staff member on a daily basis by an authorized individual listed on their form. All children must arrive at Summer Day Camp no later than 9:00 am. State issued photo identification may be required to release a child. Children age 10 and over will be allowed to sign themselves out if the parent has indicated so on the registration form. Extended care is available before and after the scheduled activities at no cost.

Absent Policy



Please contact the Y by 9:00 am on the days your child will be absent from camp. It is important for us to know where your child is on days they are enrolled in the program. No refunds will be given due to non-attendance.

Illness/Injury



The health and safety of your child is a priority. If an illness or injury happens during the camp day, we will provide first aid as needed. Parents will be notified of minor injuries at the time of pick up. For more serious injuries, we will make every attempt to contact the parent or guardian using all numbers provided on the enrollment form. It may be necessary for you to pick up your child from camp. If an injury warrants, we will call emergency personnel and have the child taken to the nearest hospital. Please make sure to complete the medical questions on the registration form if your child should need specific medical assistance.

Behavior, Conduct, and Discipline



We expect all Summer Day Camp participants to behave according to our guidelines. All efforts will be made to guide children to appropriate behavior. If the behavior is not corrected, a communication form will be completed, and may require the signature of a parent/guardian. If the child continues to demonstrate the inappropriate behavior, he/she may be suspended for one day. If the behavior has still not improved, the child may be removed from the program for the remainder of its duration. The Y reserves the right to bypass the steps listed above and/or terminate a child's enrollment if the child's behavior poses a threat to the safety of himself or others. If a child is suspended or removed from the program, no refund will be given.

Sessions
